Heard Museum "Around the World:

The Heard Museum Collection" is a global span of objects from the museum's permanent collection.

Ongoing. "HOME: Native People of the Southwest" is a 2,100-square-foot exhibition from the Heard's permanent collection.

Ongoing. "Remembering Our Indian School Days: The Boarding School Experience" examines the federally run boarding school system started in 1879 to assimilate American Indian children into American culture.

Ongoing. "Every Picture Tells a Story" is a kid-friendly exhibition about the meanings behind designs and symbols in American Indian artwork. Ongoing. "Remix: New Modernities in a Post Indian World": Representing the next generation of progressive and experimental indigenous artists, this contemporary exhibition collectively searches for a new language of artistic practice and pushes the boundaries of the expected. "Young Jewelers Exhibit" Featuring the work of eight prominent young American Indian jewelers, this exhibit illustrates how jewelry expresses individuality and shared experiences that emphasize the artists' community and family.

Phoenix Art Museum "Graffiti

Art and Fashion" This exhibition explores the art form's origins and its evolution in fashion and graphics, with early jackets and clothing painted by original graffiti artists. Through Feb. 24.

"Illuminated Manuscripts" The exhibition features the nearly-completed St. John's Bible, which is the first handwritten, illuminated Bible created since the invention of the printing press over 500 years ago. Through March 9.

"Richard Avedon: Photographer of Influence" Features both Avedon's early fashion photographs as well as his revealing portraits of actors, politicians, artists, writers, and intellectuals.
